Anton Garcia Abril on "Celibidachiana": "Celibidachiana" represents my profound consideration for a friend and Maestro. Celibidachiana is a piece dedicated to the great Maestro and friend Sergiu Celibidache. This is not just a special dedication to him, but also I wanted to get close to the "celibidachian" understanding of music. The esthetic-technical attitude of Celibidache towards the musical phenomenon must be profoundly analyzed. Celibidache gets close to music with a philosophy filled with greatness and simplicity. The technical inspiration and intuition bring out his personality as an artist. He is capable of impressing even the composer of the piece. And what is difficult to analyze and explain in art, is transformed by Sergiu Celibidache, following a scientifical and psychological study, in an additional aspect of that "musical phemenology", which can be called a constant of his personality. These points of view briefly denoted, and many others of the human nature represent "the celibidachian" from which the title of the piece impresses. These conditions which coincide with my total attention of an esthetic-technical nature over music represent in a certain way the motivation or the departing point to create this "elegy for orchestra".





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**Enrique Garcia Asensio** declared numerous times that Maestro Sergiu Celibidache was for him like a second father. He also mentions that "the day I met Sergiu Celibidache was like winning the lottery".

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
