

Trăiește muzica, trăiește sunetul

The Concert Series of the Sergiu Celibidache Festival is inaugurated with "The Pocket Garden" composition by Sergiu Celibidache

On the 30th of June, at the Romanian Athenaeum, the audience will encounter the composition of Sergiu Celibidache, "The Pocket Garden", which had the first Romanian audition in lasi, in 2006.

Composed by Sergiu Celibidache in 1978, Der Taschengarten (The Pocket Garden) is a suite for orchestra in 13 parts. The idea was born out of a close collaboration with children and is also – in the tradition of impressionist ballet for children – dedicated to them. The music presents common points with the styles of Maurice Ravel and Igor Stravinsky

Celibidache gives a particular importance to sound effects. For example, this appears in the second part of "The Wind Stays Still, the Flowers Sing", an idyllically swing between the wooden blow instruments (the tulips) accompanied by strings with sordine, harp and celeste (the wind). The seventh part "At Night the Carp Sing Its Song" is a polyphonic composition; Celibidache uses this device of musical writing because the listener can understand at the same just a few voices, similar to a lake full of fishes from which a few can be seen at the same time. The blend of Tibetan temple sounds with lyrical sounds is embodied by the tenth part, "The Green Prayer". In the twelfth part, "It Rains with Sun in the Sprinkler", the music imitates the murmur of the rain drops.

"The Pocket Garden" appeared in 1979, in a recording with the Stuttgart Radio Symphonic Orchestra, at the Deutsche Grammophon record house, a UNICEF benefit-production.

At the same time with the recording of the 1979 piece (Deutsche Grammophon), a few of the photographs from his early days as a conductor and a text which Celibidache wrote at the same time with the piece were published. The text will be presented during the concert by the storyteller.
